

## From the President's Desk



Following a profitable year in 2024, RAM has maintained strong operating performance through the first quarter. This winter was relatively mild, with intermittent cold snaps but low snowfall totals. With less snow accumulation, we're hoping for steady, soaking rains this spring to restore moisture levels and reduce fire risk ahead of green-up.

The lower snowfall has also minimized the usual winter-related risks, such as structural collapses and ice dams. However, despite below-average snow, we have still seen our share of ice- and snow-related automobile accidents, though workers' compensation claims for slip-and-fall incidents have been fewer.

Steve Knutson For the first two months of 2025, RAM estimates a pre-tax profit of approximately \$5 million, providing a solid financial cushion. March has also seen strong operating performance, though the massive storm system that passed just south of us on March 14 was a close call. Severe convective storms, along with wind and hail damage, impacted our neighboring states of Iowa and Wisconsin. Hopefully, we can steer clear of these early spring storms.

RAM processed 764 direct lines claims in January and February, a decrease from the 983 recorded during the same period in 2024. Additionally, our member companies assumed reinsurance business has seen favorable results so far in 2025. Collectively, our membership incurred five recoverable reinsurance claims in the first two months of the year, up from four in 2024. Of these, four impacted Layer 1, with estimated losses of \$515,000, while three extended into Layer 2, totaling an estimated loss of \$403,800. The claims included three dwelling and contents fires, one farm outbuilding and UFPP fire, and one UFPP hay fire.

In the first two months of 2025, our insurance premium in force grew by 4.1 percent, while our total policy count declined by 335 through February. This includes a decrease of 364 policies in Minnesota, partially offset by an increase of 29 in North Dakota. With more controlled growth and a surplus increase in 2024, we are currently reassessing our growth restrictions. Additionally, we anticipate a rise to our assumed reinsurance premiums due to elevated exposure. As of now, we reinsure 51 member companies, down from 53, following two mergers that took effect on January 1, 2025.

Our membership demonstrated strong support for RAM in 2023 and 2024 by fully purchasing our \$15 million offering of guaranty fund certificates. At our March board meeting, the board of directors approved the payment of all outstanding interest for 2022, 2023, and 2024. We are now awaiting approval from the Minnesota Department of Commerce to distribute these interest payments. A heartfelt thank you to our member companies for their continued support of RAM!

On behalf of the RAM board of directors and staff, I want to express my sincere appreciation to our member companies, agents, and policyholders for your unwavering support.

This will be my final message in *RAMdom Thoughts* as President and CEO. It has been my pleasure working alongside so many wonderful people over the years. May God continue to richly bless each one of you.
